We are very pleased to be sending home your child’s report. We hope you find it useful and informative. Teachers have made reference to the end of year National Curriculum expectations for your child for English and Maths.

We have included targets for your child to work on, which we know parents have found useful. We have also grouped similar subjects, which may have been taught in a cross-curricular way, rather than keeping them separate. Please see overleaf for a reminder with regards to statutory curricular information which you may find useful (especially if your child is in Year 2 or Year 6).

**Attendance** – You can also see which attendance bracket your child falls into against all children nationally.

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All schools monitor attendance in the same way – each day is split into two sessions and the attendance register is taken in the morning and in the afternoon. Your child’s attendance will be based on number of possible sessions from 5<sup>th</sup> September to date and number of sessions attended during the same period. Authorised absence and unauthorised absence will be totalled together to give a percentage figure for absence for the academic year. If you have taken any unauthorised leave (for example a term time holiday) this will also be noted. We appreciate that for some of our children this is due to illness and therefore understandable and we have a record of children with health conditions. However it is useful to know, if this is not the case, where your child’s attendance sits in comparison with children nationally.

### **Curricular Information:**

Compulsory national curriculum subjects at primary school are:

- English
- maths
- science
- design and technology
- history
- geography
- art and design
- music
- physical education (PE), including swimming
- computing
- ancient and modern foreign languages (at key stage 2)

In addition Religious Education is a statutory subject and must be taught, although it is not part of the National Curriculum.

Schools often also teach:

- personal, social and health education (PSHE)
- citizenship
- modern foreign languages (at key stage 1)

Children are assessed in English (Reading, Writing and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar), Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning) and Science.

In a Primary school, there are two Key Stages at which this assessment is made. These are Key Stage 1 at age 7, and Key Stage 2 at age 11.

This year the results of these assessments at Y2 and Y6 will be reported as a 'scaled score'. The expected standard is 100. Children working below this will not yet have met the end of Key Stage Standard and those above will be deemed to have met or exceeded it, based on the assessments taken.

In other year groups, your child's report will include information about whether he or she is meeting the end of year age-related expectations.

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
