Pupil premium is extra Government funding to boost the learning of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close any gaps between them and their peers.

If you think your child might be entitled to Free School Meals we encourage you to please [follow this link to information on the B&NES website](#) and apply online. If your child is eligible and you do not apply immediately when they start school, they will still get an infant free lunch but the school could miss out on up to three years' funding.
