Year 6 have recently had a visit from the charity Stand Against Violence, to run an all-day workshop. During this session, the children were told about the aims of the charity and about a young man called Lloyd who was murdered and the impact that this murder had on the wider society, both from the points of view of the victim's family and the man who was convicted of Lloyd's murder. They did art, drama, and discovery games, all linked to the story. They learned about the effects of alcohol on decision-making through interactive games and activities, which gave them a valuable life lesson. In the afternoon children spent time learning about the effects of drugs on behaviour and the influence of the county lines drugs model.
