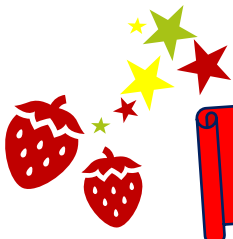
Sports round-up

We have been delighted to be able to resume sports activities and what a bumper term it has been!

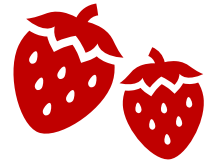

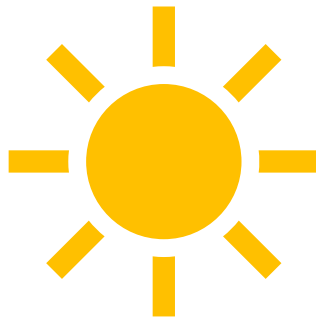
